

Dear Friends,

If our *Christianity Explored* courses at St Laurence were a box-set, we would now (as I write) have reached Series 4, Episode 3. Although not really the primary focus of the course, in each of the four Series so far at least one group member has hit upon a common theme, namely the **ultimate purpose** of our individual lives. Naturally, the questions have been phrased in a different way each time, but the general gist has been: *What should I be doing with my life, time and other resources?* or *Why am I actually here?**

These crucial philosophical questions also came to the fore recently when I was asked to preach at a funeral-service on an Old Testament passage (from the book of Ecclesiastes):

There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens:

a time to be born and a time to die;

a time to plant and a time to uproot;

a time to kill and a time to heal;

a time to tear down and a time to build;

a time to weep and a time to laugh;

a time to mourn and a time to dance...

Now, in listing all these activities, the original author was not – as we might imagine – celebrating the diversity of human experience and achievement; but rather (and rather depressingly!) he was seeking to put all our activities into their proper context. A few verses later, he writes:

All have the same breath; humans have no advantage over animals.

Everything is meaningless. All go to the same place: all come from dust, and to dust all return.

‘Everything is meaningless.’ Yikes! Of course, there are many wonderful moments in life, big and small. Just last week over a post-tennis drink at The Plough, one club stalwart said how privileged he’d felt to be playing tennis on a sunny Spring evening in *such* a beautiful location. However... the sobering thrust of Ecclesiastes is that, in the end, even the memories of our very best days will fade; since, quite apart from anything else, we too will die and return to dust. At which point, those crucial questions confront us all: *What is the point, actually?* Or, as Bob Geldof put it in the title of his autobiography: *Is that it?*

The Christian response to these biggest of Big Questions is: *No, actually – but only because of Jesus.* Were it not for Easter and Pentecost, death and dust would have the final say on us all; and everything, all our activity and achievements, would ultimately be rendered meaningless. The death and resurrection of Jesus, however, pave the way for an alternative and better future: not only did death and dust have no claim on him, but at Pentecost, Jesus began to share with his followers the new, *eternal* life which he himself was enjoying. This is why he really **is** the **Best News** we could ever hear; and why, if you can, I’d love you to join us one Sunday at church or to sign up for Series 5...



GARDENING CLUB



At its AGM on 10th May, members elected the Committee for the coming year – a group that, despite the Chairman's urgings for new blood, bears a marked similarity to the previous year's Committee! Sue Johnson has, however, (re)-joined, replacing Diana Lawrence as Treasurer, although Diana is fortunately remaining on the Committee. Once the formal AGM business was (swiftly) over, members were treated to a fascinating lecture by James Campbell from Garden Organic near Coventry (see <https://www.gardenorganic.org.uk/>). James spoke to us about the work of the Heritage Seed Library, which conserves and supplies vegetable varieties that are not widely available. They are not a gene bank, but supply seed from their catalogue, or send seeds to their members (six packets free, for a modest annual subscription). It was sobering to discover that much of the currently available commercial seed is grown in places like China, and that the UK retailers with familiar names are all owned by only three multinational companies.

The Club's lecture series takes a break now through the summer months and will restart in October. But before that is the Appleton Show, which will take place on Sunday 3rd September at 2.00 pm. Copies of the Show Schedule, outlining all the veg, fruit, flower and other classes, will be available in Appleton Community Shop from the start of June. Over the summer, you may like to be composing photos to compete in one of the Photography Classes. (You don't have to be a Club member to compete in the Show.)
