Dear Friends,

I have been invited to write again about 'New Beginnings' and I have just reached that stage in life when I think back over time and recall a whole host of events in my life that represented new beginnings. Having said this, I have this morning also just reached that stage in my life when I searched high and low for a belt to put on my trousers only to discover that it was already there. There are also those events that my wife attempts to get me to recall but I cannot. I especially cannot recall that moment on a beach in France, when I walked fully-clothed into a toilet – which instead turned out to be an automatic shower!

When you read this, our newly licensed Rector, Ken Campbell, will have arrived - no doubt eventually with some exciting ideas about new ways ahead for our community. And our new Head-teacher, Mrs Amy Carnell, will have already completed a month in her new appointment. On 7th September the school held their 'Start of Term' service in church. In front of me sat twenty nine newly-arrived children – some smiley, others slightly nervous, all experiencing their new beginnings in school as the Foundation Year. Strangely enough, for some inexplicable reason, this year the majority of these newcomers are girls. Alongside these children were some one hundred and fifty others all moving ahead with new-beginnings in new classes.

Also, when you read this, the children in school will have completed their 3 days of Prayer Space where they will have had an opportunity to express their thoughts and feelings about New Beginnings within a safe and caring environment. When I look back in all of this, I am reminded of past events

in my own family – not just our children moving ahead with their school lives – but also such things as holidays together. In those days, we were allowed to pull down the back seats of the car and lift our children in still asleep at 2.00 a.m. Three hours or so later we would find ourselves on Dartmoor having bowls of cereal for breakfast, and watching the sun rising. Of course I reminisce, and I guess reminiscing is ok. Or is it? I make no apologies for the fact that I am a Christian – even if not a very good one – and being a Christian may sometimes offer challenges. Although of course, even if not a Christian, one still faces challenges. From a Christian perspective, we are often warned about the dangers of looking back. When a man said to Jesus, I will follow you but first let me go and bury my father, he replied, "Let the dead bury their own dead, but you go and proclaim the Kingdom". Yet again we read about another man who said to Jesus, 'Yes I will follow you but first let me go back and say goodbye to my family'; to which Jesus replied, "No one who puts his hand to the plough and looks back is fit for service in the kingdom of God". And when we begin to consider an overall picture – an overall understanding about what Jesus is 'getting at' – I believe that we are being asked to move on with our lives and to move on in his name.

Paul sums this up succinctly in his second letter to the people of Corinth, when he writes, "If we come to Jesus he says this, 'Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; and behold, the new has come'".

Embo update and Harvest Giving

For the past four years, St Laurence Church have been supporting Medic Assist International through their harvest giving, and by other means, in particular for the project in Embo, KwaZulu Natal, South Africa. The PCC have committed to continue this support for as long as the project is being supported by MAI. Embo is an impoverished black community in the Valley of a Thousand Hills with a population of around 37,000, with high rates of HIV and Aids, as well as very poor living conditions and malnourishment. Two years ago the church in Embo built a clinic with the support of MAI, and in 2015 there were over 20,000 appointments. With MAI's support the church is providing 10 caregivers who go out into the community, as well as supporting a crèche and orphanage. For the second year running I was lucky enough to join a team of Christian volunteers from MAI to go and help at the church, crèche and orphanage, while my medical colleagues helped at the clinic and with the caregivers who are doing an amazing job. I will be showing a short DVD from the trip at our Harvest Service at church at 10am on Sunday 2nd October, which will be led by John Earwicker from Christ Church, Abingdon and Executive Director of MAI. Please do come and hear more about it. You may be interested in joining a trip in the future?

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO BUS USERS

On Wednesday October 12th the first Oxfordshire Comet minibus service will run from Hinton Waldrist into Oxford via Longworth, Appleton and Cumnor. The minibus will leave Hinton Waldrist at 10.00am arriving in Oxford at approximately 10.45am and will return from Oxford at 1.00pm arriving back at Hinton Waldrist at about 1.45pm.

The plan is to make this a once weekly service on Wednesdays provided there is sufficient take up to make it viable. As the Comet scheme is still at the pilot stage there will be no charge to passengers for a limited period. Discussions on financing are ongoing.

The continuation of this service will depend on whether enough people use it so its future is not guaranteed at this stage. I would urge as many bus users as possible to take advantage of this new service being offered which to some degree helps to alleviate the difficulties caused by the withdrawal of the 63 Thames Travel village bus though I appreciate that the timing and day agreed for the Comet service will not suit everyone.

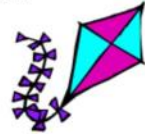

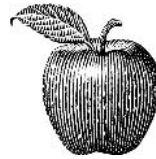
