Dear Friends,

As you've enjoyed a walk down to the woods on a beautiful sunny day passing through St Laurence Churchyard, I wonder whether our lovely St Laurence stained glass window has caught your eye? I doubt it actually – as from the outside little detail would have been visible. **But** – if you'd entered the Church (which is always open in daylight hours!) – you would have seen this window in quite literally a different light! As the sun streams through, all its details shine out clearly and the resplendent play of the different colours reflected together is stunning. The difference, very obviously, is all about seeing the window – and the story it tells - from the outside or the inside!

And this is actually a picture of how we can view and understand the story of Holy Week and Easter. Sadly, a large number of people now know very little about what lies at the very heart of the Christian faith and the hope we share as the consequence of these momentous events which have changed the world and countless human lives. By so many, this festival is now seen as just another occasion for holiday with hot cross buns and Easter eggs thrown in for good

measure. However, it is very evident that a huge number of people – both men and women – continue to choose to wear a cross! I wonder how many really understand why!

To truly know and begin to appreciate all that Holy Week and Easter means we need to “come inside”, as it were, not merely taking a momentary glance – if one's taken at all – from the “outside”. I've found time and again that many people dismiss it all knowing very little of the facts or the evidence – and not least regarding the resurrection of Jesus on that first Easter Day. This is all about the reality of God in Christ reconciling the world to himself and the course of history being changed in the process – and is as relevant to our lives and our world today as ever.

Once again we very warmly invite all to join us during Lent, Holy Week and Easter at St Laurence as we journey together to the Cross and then rejoice in the wonder and celebration of Easter Day. And if you are away at this time – you can seek God's love wherever you may be – and of-course the story of this love and the tremendous gift of life it offers is not limited to just one week in the year! Don't be content to stand on the outside “looking in” - the view is

so much clearer and more beautiful from the inside!

The Appleton Manors – Part 2

Much time and effort has gone into trying to find Appleton's Quarrelstead Manor - last heard of 400 years ago.

The last word was in 1980. Rev Paul Tuckwell and Elizabeth Kitson thought that the site of The Close was the best bet. It was a large site with a Dovecote dating back to the 1600s. But it wasn't the Close.

By chance Diane Collacut asked me if I knew anything of her house or land – I didn't. She said that she had some deeds of her house that mentioned Pembroke College. We didn't know of any land belonging to Pembroke in Appleton. How Pembroke's lands escaped the Enclosure process is a bit of a puzzle. Diane then mentioned the name the "Quarrels" in her Deeds.

On hearing of this fabled name – Quarrels – I hofooted it to the Archives of Pembroke College.

Here I was faced with six documents. Five were in English on vellum – from the 1600s – that I couldn't read. The sixth was a very large indenture from early 1800s. This I could read. There was a map on the second page – setting out a clear picture of West Appleton showing the Quarrelstead Manor and Estate.

The estate was about 120 acres of fields and strips. Quarrelstead Manor is clearly "South Lawn" – home to the Dick family for 80 years. The outbuildings are much the same but the Manor House has now been extended eastward. Over time it's likely that the Manor has been rebuilt. Experts are now looking at the house and site to see how much of Roger Quarrel's home from the 1300s remains.



Dog fouling in the village: Important update

The parish council has received numerous complaints regarding dog mess this month. Long Close is especially affected which is causing a problem for the gardening team who have to maintain the field. The field is used for the annual Easter Egg hunt as well as Appleton Quest in the summer. Appleton school children walk across the field to access Besselsleigh Woods, and doing the risk assessment is becoming increasingly difficult due to the vast amounts of dog mess on the field. It is also becoming a problem for Park Lane residents who are picking up dog mess off their verges and drive ways. Many other parts of Appleton are also affected by dog mess.

The Manor's gardening team are going to be taking photographic evidence and gathering information of any dog owners who don't pick up their dog's mess and they will pass this information on to the Vale of White Horse Environmental Health who will then decide if a fine will be issued. The parish council are fully supporting this and encourage all parishioners to report anyone who does not pick up their dog's mess to the Environmental Protection Department at the Vale of White Horse District Council. env.health@southandvale.gov.uk / 01235 540555.
