remembering

Once again November moves us into a special time of Remembrance – the month of red poppies and the feast of All Souls – both of which cause us to remember with love and deep appreciation the sacrifice and lives of those both known and unknown to us who have played such a huge part in making our own lives all that they are today.

“Remembering” is such an important part of the human psyche in the ways in which we learn, think and act. Memory, itself, is a very precious thing – and the great sadness and distress of those who develop dementia in one of its many forms and for those who love and care for them is, of-course, the fading and absence of memory. It’s incredible how some things remain at times, however, even in the most unexpected ways. I have an enduring memory of my own on one occasion during my six month placement whilst training for ordination. The seaside Parish included an inordinate number of residential care homes and all received their Christmas visits and Services. On one afternoon in one of the Homes with a relatively small number of very elderly residents there was one lady with total dementia who scarcely ever spoke a word any more. But as we began to sing one of the well-loved Carols her face completely changed, she began to mouth all the words and a few even quietly escaped her lips! A very special moment indeed!

But is it always right and good to remember simply **everything**? Remembrance Sunday is obviously a time of legitimate and important remembering “lest we forget.” But are there truly some

things that we should do our best to forget? We all know how sharp the thrust when we are personally caused to re-live the pain of a harsh or unkind word said to us or a thoughtless act, including the distress of being falsely accused, being taken for granted or simply being misunderstood. But even when we’ve sincerely sought to forgive those who’ve hurt us in some way – and they may well be people we really love, too – how easy it is at times to revive that hurt and resentfully compound it! Rob Parsons who leads the national charity “Care for the Family”, calls it bringing out stored up “mortar bombs” to hurl afresh! Perhaps someone has – albeit annoyingly - let you down in some way even with profuse apology! How tempting it is on such an occasion to recall and revive past resentments, too! *“The trouble is, you’re always letting me down! What about the time – ok, maybe it was three years ago – when you didn’t do what you’d promised! And I remember feeling so hurt that other time, too, when you didn’t remember that special anniversary and what about……?”* Sometimes we may not actually give these retorts verbally – but still fuel them up again inside us!

Of-course, there are some very damaging and deep hurts which cannot simply be “forgotten” and need very real help – and justice – before any depth of healing of distressing hurt and memory is possible, such as is evidenced at the present time by the appalling hidden suffering of so many over years of exploitation of

physical and sexual abuse, not least by those in positions of trust. But whether serious or less serious hurts and experiences, whether as victim or otherwise, one thing is very apparent in us as human beings – we by nature find it very hard to forget! And this is why we find it difficult to get our heads around the notion of a God who not only forgives but who is willing to “forget”, too! A God who doesn’t keep a “tally stick” of everything we’ve ever done wrong (and how huge such a stick would be for each one of us!) – to wave and threaten us with when we need to come to ask for forgiveness again. Of-course this does presuppose that we are genuinely sorry and really want to do our best not to commit the same wrong again which is what that rather unpopular word “repentance” is all about which is far more than simple remorse.

But we read in Psalm 103 of the wonderful reassurance God wants to give – here in the words from “The Message” by Eugene Peterson – The Bible in Contemporary Language:

*“God is sheer mercy and grace;
not easily angered, he’s rich in love.
He doesn’t endlessly nag and scold,
nor hold grudges for ever.
He doesn’t treat us as our sins deserve,
nor pay us back in full for our wrongs.
As high as heaven is over the earth,
so strong is his love to those who fear
him.
As far as sunrise is from sunset,
he has separated us from our sins.”*

As we look at our world and our own lives we acknowledge how difficult it is at times for us to be able both to “remember” and to “forget” in all the right ways! May we know the grace of the fullness of God’s love throughout this season of

remembering – and his help alongside to legitimately “forget” in whatever ways we may each need to.

Access track to lock

Many residents use the tarmac track down to the lock, and are welcome to do so when the gate is open (although there is no public right of way). The Parish Council has been asked to remind residents that the track is private property of AH Cornish (the Gow family) and they should respect that it passes through a working farm. Walkers must only use the tarmac track (not enter the fields including the camp site area), and must, without exception, keep all dogs on leads and always remove any dog poo. (dog poo may contain canine neosporosis which can cause cattle to abort). We enjoy walking down to the lock and it would be a shame if this privilege is lost.

In last months issue we mentioned Barretts field as being behind the tennis courts. It is actually behind the Jubilee Park playground.


