

Dear Friends,

*The only thing that never
changes in this world is change!*

The start of another new year! How strange to be writing this with rather a lot of the very important last month of the old year still to come! But in under just three weeks the calendar turns again and there's always something about this that raises expectations of various kinds. Once before I wrote about "change" and the different ways in which we can view it. Some people are all but terrified by it – others positively seek to embrace it and are never happy to "stand still" – most are probably somewhere in between! For me, personally, change is not something that I particularly relish or always find easy to deal with – but know through much experience that once accepted and grasped hold of in the right way, it can be positively energising and bring great blessing.

Obviously there are great changes in this next year for Phil and myself with my forthcoming retirement as priest-in-charge here at the end of April. Many aspects of these changes are going to be hard – and sad, too - and the

tummy is definitely full of "butterflies" at times as I contemplate it all. But we've also thankfully been given the confidence to anticipate and accept this – and retirement was always, of-course, on the horizon, even if deferred for another year or two – and for a priest – and his/her family - this always means change and a move!

A period of interregnum and the eventual appointment of my successor will, of-course, also mean change this year for the Church and community at large. And just a few months later follows another big change with Mrs Brown's retirement as Head Teacher of our village school. But such changes are not only inevitable as time goes by – but can also prove to be both invigorating and positive for everyone concerned when managed in the right way.

"The right way!" – well, what can that mean? I've used that phrase twice now! Someone once wrote about change: *"It's not so much that we're afraid of change or so in love with the old ways, but it's that place in between that we fear ...It's like being between trapezes. There's nothing to hold on to."*

Thankfully both for us, personally, now

heading towards that place “in between” and for the Church here, too, there’s just so much for us to be able to hold on to – and indeed for our Church school, too - as we put our trust in the strongest hands of all – the God who loves us unceasingly and directs, holds and enables us in all the callings he gives us and the changes and challenges which follow. Undoubtedly there are many others, too, right now anticipating some kind of change and upheaval in their lives over the coming months – and we do know that some changes are far harder to bear than others. But my continuing prayer for everyone in our lovely community here and for the whole community, itself, is for the willingness to take that important step of faith for themselves in seeking the love and help of the only one who is truly unchanging, and to find in doing so that there is plenty indeed to hold on to as you “swing between the trapezes.” Rather it’s the other way round, too – finding yourselves being very safely “held.”

But I’m going nowhere yet! And we know these last months with you all will be very special. So with my continuing love and prayers as another new year begins,

Riding for the Disabled Association - RDA - Abingdon Group

The RDA is a charitable organisation in the UK supporting thousands of children and adults with a wide range of disabilities including Appleton's para-equestrian dressage rider, Molly Bowen-Morris. The charity has many local volunteer groups who offer horse riding lessons and therapy sessions to individuals with specialist instructors in a supportive and friendly environment. RDA activities typically include riding, carriage driving, vaulting and show jumping which bring a new dimension to restricted lives by encouraging independence, giving confidence and generally improving each rider's well-being.

The Abingdon RDA Group, located in Southmoor, was established in 1975 and is still the only group in Oxfordshire. This year the group celebrated 40 years of helping children and adults aged 2 to 70 to reach therapeutic goals and achieve personal ambitions as well as having a lot of fun along the way. The Group caters for many diverse disabilities, including learning difficulties, cerebral palsy, multiple sclerosis and muscular dystrophy.

The centre is based at Lower Lodge Riding Centre in Southmoor and currently has 85 riders, 150 volunteers & 12 ponies and is in high demand for their highly valued care and therapy. Volunteers regularly give up their time to support the riders as well as charitable donations to help with the cost of keeping ponies and running the riding centre. However, RDA Abingdon is currently searching for additional volunteers who will be provided with training, have fun and are extremely valuable to the riders. The Group is also constantly looking for support from local fundraising initiatives and kind donations.

Did You Know That....

Oxford Whole Foods was founded to help disabled people with their careers and recently celebrated 25 years in business.

Operating from Osney Mead, this not-for-profit company began its life in the Slade Hospital, when an occupational therapist working there thought that weighing and packaging food could be a therapeutic occupation for adults with learning difficulties.

From this small start, the company has gone from strength to strength, providing therapy for local people with disabilities and supplying more than 100 Co-op outlets with their pre-packaged wholefoods.
