Dear Friends,

For hundreds of years the bells of St Laurence have rung out – to call the faithful to worship, celebrate marriages, ring in the New Year and in remembrance - and the bells of Appleton are steeped in tradition. 'March 4th Day' is the "birthday" of the bells and since 1818 it has been celebrated every year. The story of its origins is fascinating.

The 1552 inventories show Appleton Church as having three bells which remained, in the tower until 1817. In the land enclosures of 1815 the then lord of the Manor Robert Southby, took more land than he was entitled to. There was considerable resentment in the village and many of Southby's own farm workers downed tools because the common land upon which they had freely grazed their animals had been enclosed. There were even rumours of an impending riot!

As part of the appeasement process which followed Robert Southby paid for the replacement of the existing three bells with a new ring of six, cast by Thomas Mears of London.

The new ring was dedicated on 4th March 1818, when the whole village was given a public holiday and entertained on the village green with ale and roasted hog - all at the expense of Squire Southby.

Ringers and friends from a considerable distance have celebrated the anniversary of that day in Appleton every year since, with peal ringing and a dinner. The evening's celebrations include the singing of a song composed by John Harding, the village schoolmaster first sung on 4th March 1818.

Many other 'traditional' songs are performed by members of the

Appleton Society and visiting friends as well as handbell tune and change ringing.

Among those first Appleton ringers was Alfred White, (my great, great grandfather). Through him the Appleton bells were augmented to eight in 1854 and later to ten. The small roof on top of the tower was added in 1861 to make room for the extra bells, which hang on an upper frame. Amongst the 519 peals rung since 1855 are many which were record lengths at the time. They include 21,363 changes of Stedman Caters rung in 12 hours and 25 minutes in 1922; 16,271 changes of Grandsire Caters rung in 1932 and 22,899 Stedman Caters in 1978. Alfred founded the Bell hangers company - White's of Appleton in 1824. He was innkeeper at "The Greyhound", Besselsleigh where he also ran a bakery, the village shop and a forge. One of Alfred's sons, Frederick took over the running of the Company in 1876. During his working life he installed massive new oak bell frames at Christ Church Cathedral and Merton and Magdalen Colleges in Oxford. He moved to The Three Horseshoes in Appleton circa 1880 and from there to a newly built workshop in the centre of the village. The current owners Brian and Diana White are the fifth generation of the White family to run it.

The bells were last restored in 1977, in great part through the generosity of the Blackwell family who have been patrons and friends of Appleton bells for many years. Sir Basil Blackwell attended the March 4th dinner for many years and sang 'There's a Hole in My Bucket Dear Lisa' with his daughter Penelope. Son Toby, also a

great friend of Appleton and its ringers later succeeded him in this performance.

As we approach the 200th anniversary of this unbroken tradition in March 2018 we are planning other events which we hope will interest many of you, so watch this space!

Most people have the ability to become a good ringer. Great physical strength is not required and people of all ages from 10 upwards are welcome. Perhaps you used to ring and would consider taking it up again? If you think you might be a little rusty, don't worry! You'll be surprised at just how quickly and easily you can pick up ringing again. 

BIN IT, DON'T BLOCK IT!

"Everything that goes down your sink, bath, shower, toilet, washing machine and dishwasher goes into the same pipe that connects to the sewer. This pipe is only 10cm wide, just big enough for a cricket ball, and easy to block. Myth busters:- Wet wipes do not break down like toilet paper. Even if they say 'flushable' they still block pipes and should never go down the toilet.- Pouring hot water and washing up liquid down the sink won't prevent fat or oils from setting hard in your pipes."

This information is from a Thames Water leaflet after they responded to a cry for help when loos were not flushing and sinks were gurgling and failing to drain in one area of the village. Their engineers found the main pipe down the road clogged by wet wipes.
